Overview

- The situation is NOT as dire as you might think.
- As a genealogy society leader, you have a fiduciary duty to your members to ensure survival of your society and its assets.
- How did we get to this point?

- There are SO MANY more options available to genealogy societies than 10 or even 5 years ago.

- Success formula

Project Management

+ Needs Assessment

+ Options Review + Action = SUCCESS

- Rinse and repeat!

Issues:

- **Where's our stuff?** Domain registration, server location, etc.
- **How do I remove our stuff?** Basic content, databases, membership module, email blaster
- **Won't this be expensive?** Low cost, no cost alternatives to expensive website design and hosting

Issues:

- **How do we get help?** Tech support for non-techies, and community resources.
- **How do we avoid this the next time?** Data successorship, vision, and plans for ongoing success.

Project Management

Here's why your society needs a basic project management system ...

- How often have great ideas come out of a meeting, but no one follows up?
- You need a way to visualize projects, especially tech projects, and track details, deadlines, and contingencies!

Recommended project management programs (and they're FREE!)

- **Trello**

Tips

- **Trello** is more visual and easier to use than **Slack** which is used by more tech companies and web developers
- Both platforms have great features, but some are only available with the PAID version
- Create a Project Manager position for ALL SOCIETY PROJECTS, not just website and tech projects

Needs Assessment

- Needs assessment is a review of
 - 1) current website assets;
 - 2) current website issues; and
 - 3) proposed solutions.
- Include “factors” such as timing, costs, and change management.
- Needs assessment is a perfect fit for projects and tasks via Project Management.

Options

- The problem with turn-key solutions and hiring a website designer/developer.
- Where are your current website assets?
 - Domain registration
 - Server location
 - Databases
 - Email Marketing / Email Blaster

Issues:

- **Where's our stuff?** Domain registration, server location, etc.
- **How do I remove our stuff?** Basic content, databases, membership module, email blaster
- **Won't this be expensive?** Low cost, no cost alternatives to expensive website design and hosting

Issues:

- **What website platform should I select?** How do I select the right platform for our society? What if we change our minds?
- **How do I migrate our stuff?** Once I've exported what I need, how do I get it up to the new platform?

Issues:

- **How do I let our members know what's going on?** Map out a change management communication plan.
- **How do we keep our website healthy?** What do we need to do going forward?
- **How do we make sure this doesn't happen again?** Don't just rely on your website platform!

Where's Our Stuff: Domain registration

- **Check current registrar.** Use the WHOIS function at Namecheap <https://www.namecheap.com/domains/whois/>
- **Initiate transfer.** Use the process on the registrar to transfer to a new registrar.
- **Namecheap** has amazing sales on domain names and they don't renew at astronomical rates!

- **The process can be complicated.**
There is an unlock process, a waiting period, etc. You can do this, but get help if needed.
- **DO NOT TRANSFER** without letting your current web developer/web hosting company know!

Where's Our Stuff: Server Location

- **The WHOIS record should list server names:** Scroll down through the WHOIS record and locate the server names at the end of the record.
- **Search for the server name:** on Google OR enter the server name in the search field of your browser.
- **DO NOT MOVE SERVER** to new host without letting your current web developer/web hosting company know!

Where's Our Stuff: Databases

- **Databases should be on your servers:** if you have access to the backend of your servers via CPANEL, you should be able to download a backup copy.
- **DO NOT MOVE OR DELETE** databases without letting your current web developer/web hosting company know!

Where's Our Stuff:
Email Marketing /
Email Blaster

- **Some platforms have a built-in method of sending emails to society members. Usually these are proprietary mechanisms that can be better handled by other programs like **Constant Contact** and **MailChimp**.**
- Mailchimp allows up to 2,000 contacts free. Constant Contact does not have a free version. Both have non-profit discounts.

How Do I Remove Our
Stuff?

- Remember, ALWAYS TRY TO CONTACT your current website host and/or developer.
- You have a better chance of getting what you need by reaching out.
- And even if you want to stay with your current host, set up a backup plan NOW!

Won't This Be
Expensive?

- Not really. Let me show you how cheap and how easy it is to set up a domain and website on Namecheap. 5 MINUTES ... seriously
- The problem is this: customizations and programming gets expensive.
- The more you can do on your own, the more control you'll have in the future and it will be cheaper!

What website platform
should I select?

- Stick with the Ws! WordPress, Wix, Weebly or Wild Apricot. Don't forget Namecheap! It depends upon your needs ...
- **Do you need a simple quick website?** Try Namecheap, Wix, or Weebly.
- **Do you need features like membership management?** Try WordPress or Wild Apricot.

WordPress

- **IMPORTANT!** We are talking wordpress.org and **NOT** wordpress.com!
- WordPress is **OPEN SOURCE** which means the software is free and has a vibrant community of 3rd party app developers – and the “plugins” are often **FREE** as are templates!

- **HOWEVER ...** WordPress can be complicated and has a much higher learning curve than other platforms.
- My site GenealogyBargains.com runs on WordPress and I've been using it for over 10 years now.
- Your hosting provider can install WordPress for you and get you set up.

- I am working with Legacy Family Tree Webinars to develop a series of WordPress for Genealogy webinars in 2021.
- I am biased towards WordPress but if you hire a WordPress developer you could end up in the same situation with customized code and being at the mercy of the developer.

Wild Apricot

- Wild Apricot is billed as a membership management platform but, in fact, has:
 - Member Database
 - Website Builder
 - Event Management
 - Email & Contact Database

- Wild Apricot is not a platform with which I am super familiar. However here is a great example of a genealogy society website on Wild Apricot:

Weebly

- Weebly is based in San Francisco and started as a way for educators and school to quickly create websites and do so cheaply or FREE!
- Weebly has a FREE module but like all FREEMIUM programs it has limitations.
- Weebly uses innovative “drag and drop” technology – no programming needed.

- Weebly has greatly improved over the years with more apps and plugins.
- Weebly is now owned by Square, an e-commerce platform. This includes SquareSpace.

Wix

- Wix is very similar in look and feel and backend operation as Weebly.
- And like Weebly, it is a freemium platform with basic functionality for free.
- Weebly is more established and may have more support, but being a new start up Wix is more innovative.

NameCheap

- Namecheap recently just entered the web hosting industry.
- I've used Namecheap for domain registration for over 10 years.
- Setting up Namecheap websites is an easy process and cheap!

What about website
hosting!

- Some of the website platforms above are often bundled with hosting and there is no alternative.
- WordPress has its own hosting, but I recommend that you use an independent company.
- **SimplyHosting** is based in Chicago is a cheap, reliable hosting service owned by a genealogist.

- I have used **SimplyHosting** for Genealogybargains.com for almost 10 years. Great support, quick response. I get 3 Million hits a month and no major outages.
- Be careful with hosting companies like **DreamHost**, **BlueHost**, and **GoDaddy**. The first year is always cheap and then renews at an exorbitant amount.

How do I migrate our
stuff?

- Migration is NEVER an easy process and always goes smoother if you work with your current website host.
- Smart societies always backup any data they upload to any site. Make this a habit.
- If you can't get access to your content through your current website platform ...

- Manually backup what you can:
 - Save images
 - Download files
 - Copy and paste text into a Word document.
 - List your menu structure with pages, subpages, etc.
- And sometimes it is just easier to start over and start new!

How do I let our
members know what's
going on?

- Change management is KEY to an effective transfer to a new website.
 - Always keep members in the loop.
 - Be open to questions.
 - Email BEFORE something will happen and tell members the changes they will see.
 - Solicit feedback on changes.
 - Rinse and repeat.

How do we keep our
website healthy?

- Backup, backup, backup.
- Document procedures.
- Have more than one web admin.
- Don't become beholden to any one developer or platform with over customized code.

How do we make sure
this doesn't happen
again?

- Create a data succession plan.
- Always backup any content you upload.
- Document HOW you built the website. Demand documentation from your web developer.
- TRAIN more than one person to take over ... the “got hit by a bus” issue.

- Most importantly! Make sure your website is as independent as possible.
- Don't be cheap ... spend money when needed and tap into the GenSoc Soup program (coming soon!)


